


#### Understanding the Tax Bill

\$200,000 Property = \$555








#### **Our Population**






### Our Population - Projections








#### General Fund Revenues, 2018





#### Revenues % Change 2017-2018






## 2018 Highlights (Revenues)

- Total Increase for all Revenues of 7.2%
  - \$178,223 increase in General Property Taxes
- Intergovernmental Revenues
  - \$70,879 Revenue increase in GTA
  - Significant transit revenues increases, off-set by expenses
- Revenue Decreases
  - Fines, Forfeitures & Penalties (-7.7%)
  - Miscellaneous (-11.8%)




#### General Fund Expenditures, 2018

### Village Personnel Highlights

- Several new employee hires and organizational changes in 2017; supported by 2018 Budget
  - Primarily in Public Works, Fire & Rescue
- Employee health insurance
  - 13.1% increase after deductible increase
- Position Changes:
  - No new full or part-time positions added



## 2018 Highlights (Expenditures)

- -1.4% Decrease General Government
  - Decreases in Municipal Court & Legal; Election & limited IT increases
- 6.5% Increase in Parks, Recreation & Forestry
  - Notable increase to Village's forestry program to combat EAB
- 13.0% Increase Law Enforcement
  - Meeting existing contractual obligations
  - Additional full-time patrol officer and supporting equipment/supplies (\$142,000)




### 2018 Highlights (Expenditures)

#### ■ 10.3% Increases in Public Works

- Decreases in VOM contributions and road maintenance
- Funding necessary staffing adjustments made in 2017
- Significant increase in Green Bay Metro Transit expenses with implementation of new east-side hub and expansions in Village (approx. \$50,000)



#### Historical & Presented Tax Rate




2018 = **\$2.88** per \$1,000 of Assessed Value



#### Our Debt

- Debt Capacity May Not to Exceed 5% of Equalized Value
  - Village at 34.9% of Available Limit





#### Our Debt

- Debt obligations increased \$116,750
  - After applying \$123,335 of Capital Projects Levy
  - After applying \$46,455 of remaining Stadium Sales
     Tax
- Next debt issuance planned for 2019


