You are invited by the Village of Bellevue, Brown County, Wisconsin to submit a sealed proposal at or before 11:00 am. on Tuesday, May 7th, 2024 to the Village of Bellevue office. At that time, they will be opened and read aloud. Opening of bids will take place at 2828 Allouez Avenue, Bellevue, Wisconsin.

Upon entering a contract with the Village of Bellevue, insurance certificates and bonds representing the following must be presented by the party submitting successful proposal.

INSURANCE

The Contractor shall furnish the VILLAGE with proof of insurance in the amount as required by the approved specifications covering any public liability or property damage by reason of the operation of the Contractor, or Contractors' equipment, laborers, and hazard caused by said improvements. No construction (including grading) may start until proof of insurance is received. Insurance required is as follows:

1. <u>Insurance Requirements</u>

Contractor shall procure and maintain for the duration of the contract insurance against claims for injuries to persons or damages to property which may arise from or in connection with performance of the work hereunder by the Contractor, his agents, representative, employees, or subcontractors. The cost of such insurance is the Contractor's responsibility.

2. Minimum Scope of Insurance

Coverage shall be at least as broad as: Insurance Services Office commercial general liability coverage, "occurrence" form CG 0001. Insurance Service Office form number CA 0001 covering automobile liability, code 1 "any auto" and endorsement CA 0025. Workers' compensation insurance, as required in Wisconsin State Statutes, and employer's liability insurance.

3. Minimum Limits of Insurance

Contractor shall maintain limits no less than general liability: \$1,000,000 combined single limit per occurrence for bodily injury, personal injury, and property damage. A combination of primary and excess to meet this limit is acceptable. Automobile liability: \$1,000,000 combined single limit per accident for bodily injury and property damage. Workers' compensation and employers' liability: Workers' compensation limits as required by Wisconsin State Statutes and employer's liability limits of \$500,000 per accident.

4. <u>Verification of Coverage</u>

The Contractor shall furnish the VILLAGE with certificates of insurance as evidence of the required coverages. The certificates are to be on the form provided by the VILLAGE and must be received and approved by the VILLAGE before work commences. The VILLAGE reserves the right to require the Contractor to furnish complete, certified copies of all required insurance policies, at any time. The form of certificate is included in the Invitation for Bids for this project. The VILLAGE'S failure to notice or notify the Contractor of any coverage deficiencies that may be apparent in the documents submitted to the VILLAGE shall not relieve the Contractor of responsibility to provide coverage required in this contract.

5. The Contractor shall provide an Umbrella Liability Policy of: TWO MILLION DOLLARS (\$2,000,000).

The cancellation clause on all certificates of insurance shall read as follows:

"Should any of the above-described policies be cancelled before the expirations date thereof, the issuing company will mail 30 days written notice to the certificate holder named herein." (No modification to this clause will be accepted.)

CRACK FILL SPECIFICATIONS

Crackfilling

The work shall consist of routing, heat lancing, and filling of random cracks and existing transverse and longitudinal joints.

Material

The material used must be a premium quality Rubber Asphalt Joint Sealer. The sealer must meet ASTM-D6690 Type 11 Specification for Hot Pour Rubber Asphalt Sealants.

Equipment

<u>The Router</u> must be a minimum of 24 H.P. using star wheel carbide tipped router blades attached to the main cutting head. It must have in-line wheels and a cutting head capable of following random cracks. It must have automatic depth control to ensure consistent and accurate routing depths.

<u>The Air Compressor</u> must be of sufficient size to maintain a minimum air pressure of 100 P.S.I. and provide moisture and oil-free compressed air.

<u>The Heat Lance</u> is a 2,200-degree jet air torch. This cleans and dries the routed portion of the crack to ensure 100% adhesion.

<u>The Kettle</u> used for heating the sealant must be an oil jacketed double boiler type melting unit which is equipped with both agitation and recirculation systems. It must have separate temperature thermometers for both the oil bath and melting vat to ensure proper temperature for the sealant.

Construction Method

All cracks and joints must be routed to a 1 to 1 ratio. Cracks shall be blown out with a Heat Lance to clean out routed debris and dry out moisture. All routed material to be swept up and disposed of. All cracks shall be filled by a wand applicator or an overbander which overfills and squeegeed to a ratio of three (3) times the width of the routed crack.

Material Qualifications

The sealant shall be in the manufacturer's original sealed containers. Each container shall have the manufacturer's name, batch number, and manufacturer's recommendation for melting and application. Sealant must meet ASTM-D6690 Type 11 Specification for Rubber Asphalt Joint Sealant. A Village representative shall count the sealed containers of sealant prior to the start of the workday for measurement and payment.
