# Village Administration & Finance

---

The Department of Administration and Finance is responsible for administrative and financial oversight of the Village. The mission of the Department is to provide the residents of the Village with quality public services in an efficient and effective manner which is accomplished by forming cooperative partnerships with public, private and civic organizations. The Department of Administration and Finance includes the offices of the Village Administrator and Finance Director/Clerk-Treasurer.

## Operating Budget

The Village has a total budget of approximately \$23.5 million. The operating budget and the capital improvement plan (CIP) are approved annually. For the most recent reports, please visit the Village website.

## Special Assessments

The Village uses special assessments to finance street resurfacing projects. Assessments are paid directly by property owners located within a project area. Assessments per property typically occur once every 20 - 25 years and can range from \$10,000-20,000.

The Village of Bellevue's Public Works Department provides essential services like waste disposal, recycling, storm water system maintenance, sanitary sewer, street cleaning & road maintenance and water utilities.

## Street Parking



The Village does not allow parking on any Village Streets from 2 am to 6 am, November 1 - April 1. This allows our snow plow operators to push snow back from the curb safely.

# Garbage & Recycling

Harter's Fox Valley Disposal is the Village's garbage and recycling hauler. The garbage and recycling carts are owned by Harter's and can be serviced anytime at no additional cost to the residents; please call Harter's at **(888) 804-8556** for any repairs.

Garbage is collected weekly and recycling bi-weekly. When a Holiday falls on a weekday, pick-up is delayed one day. Please see the following pages for the current pick-up calendar and map. If your street is missed for collection, residents should contact Harter's directly and leave garbage/recycling bins at the curb until a pick-up is scheduled.

# Compost Site

The Village operates a licensed compost site that permitted village residents can deposit accepted materials including grass clippings, garden materials, leaves and brush, sod & small stumps and take compost and mulch for free. The site is intended for permitted village residents and contractors only. The site is open daily from 6:30 a.m. - 8 p.m. and located at 3891 Eaton Rd, Bellevue, WI 54311.

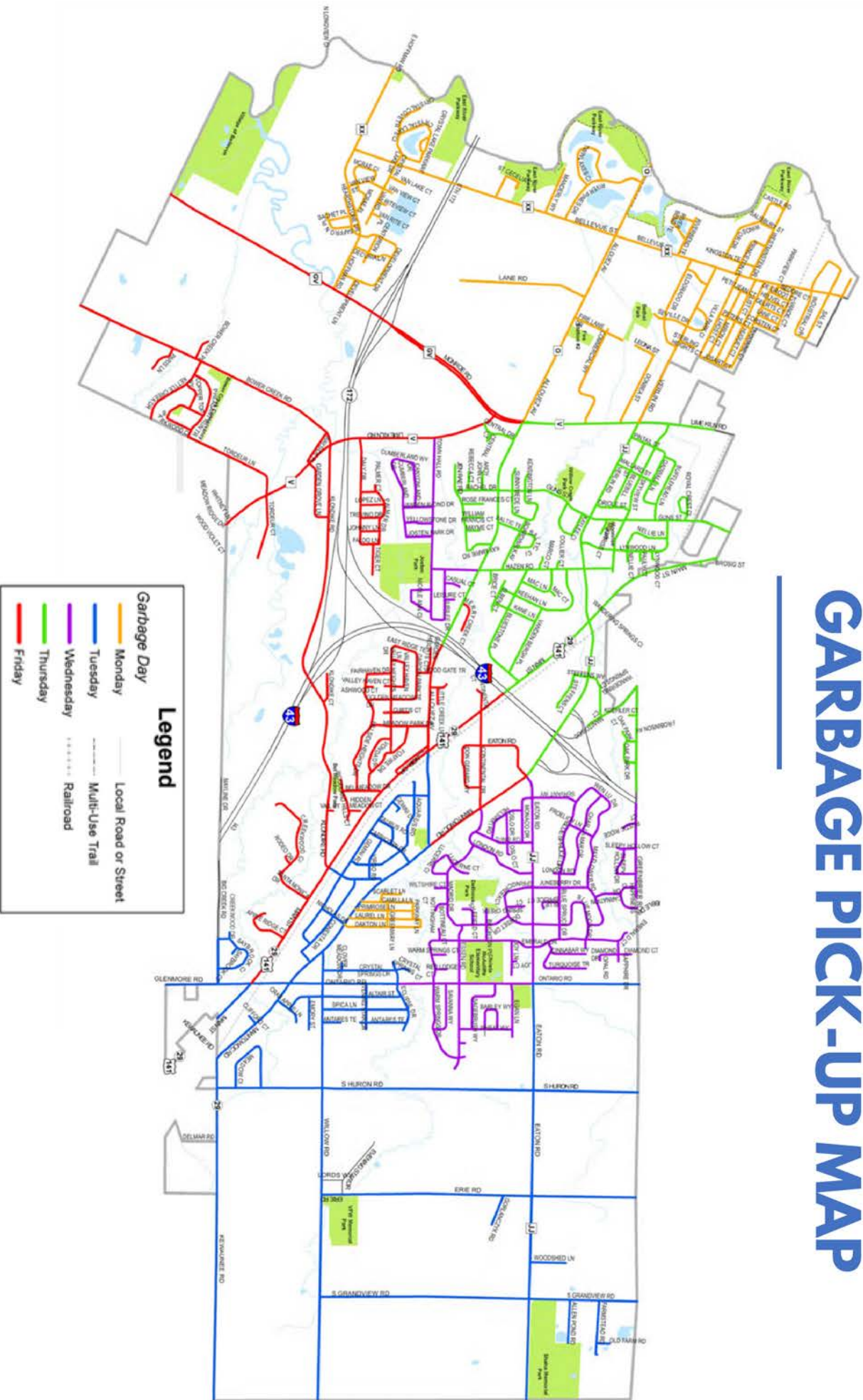

# UTILITIES

## Water

The Village's Water Utility is responsible for the maintenance, repair, replacement and operating services for the Village's water system. Water is purchased from the Manitowoc Public Utilities through the Central Brown County Water Authority.

### Monitor Your Water Usage with AquaHawk

Residents have the ability to enroll in the free water usage monitoring tool AquaHawk. AquaHawk allows users to perform a number of functions such as monitoring monthly water usage, set budget limits and notifications if their usage is trending in-line with that budget, receive leak alerts and much more!

## Utility Billing

In addition to water, utility bills also include charges for sanitary sewer, storm water and garbage & recycling services. Village residents can choose from several utility billing and payment options. Bills are issued monthly. Please consider using electronic options; as it helps us reduce utility costs.

### 1. Mail

Traditionally by default, utility customers will receive a standard bill via the United States Postal Service.

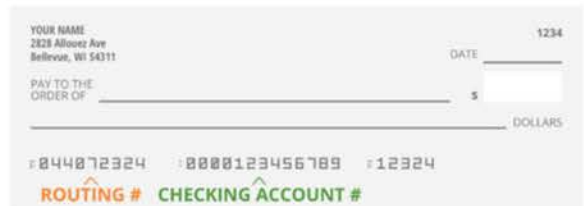

# TRAILS & CONSERVANCY

## East River Parkway & Trail

The Village offers over two miles of scenic multi-use trail along the East River. The trail runs from Manderly Way to Westminster Drive.

Parking or trail access can be found off of Westminster Drive, the west portion of the Rite Place parking lot, and at the end of Manderly Way.

The East River Trail connects five communities along the East River, beginning in Ledgeview on the south end of the trail to Green Bay on the north end of the trail. There is an ADA kayak launch off of Manderly Way.



## Osprey Point - Izaak Walton League Conservancy

Osprey Point is an 80 acre conservancy area maintained & managed in partnership with the Brown County Chapter of the Izaak Walton League.

# FORESTRY

The Forestry Division is responsible for maintaining all trees within Village parks, in the road right-of-way (street trees) and on all other village owned properties. Maintenance of the urban tree canopy includes planting, inspections, regular pruning and removals. Residents need to obtain prior permission from the Parks, Recreation & Forestry Department before pruning, removing, or planting any trees within the right-of-way adjacent to their property.

## Resident Tree Planting Program



The Village of Bellevue has a neighborhood tree planting program for residents who wish to have trees planted in the right-of-way adjacent to their property. The planting program is offered annually and runs concurrent with other Village plantings. The resident pays the wholesale cost of the tree, which includes planting. Trees purchased through the Resident Tree Planting program are guaranteed for two years.

## STREET TREE BENEFITS

Bellevue street trees provide millions of dollars of environmental, economic and aesthetic benefits to the community. Over their lifetime, street tree benefits exceed the costs of planting and care, representing a 300% return on investment. Tree benefits increase over time highlighting the importance of not only planting trees, but of providing ongoing maintenance and protection. These benefits are a reminder of the worthwhile investment in our community forestry program.

# LAW ENFORCEMENT

---

The Village of Bellevue contracts its law enforcement services from the Brown County Sheriff's Office, allowing for top-quality police services at an efficient rate for citizens.

Bellevue has nine Brown County Sheriff's Deputies in rotating 24-hour & 16-hour shifts. Officers' responsibilities include responding to calls (criminal and civil), assisting other agencies, enforcing local ordinances and state statutes and addressing immediate conditions that give rise to public safety issues for Village residents.

The Village also has two "Direct Enforcement Officers" (DEO) whose responsibilities include finding long-term solutions to reoccurring community problems through community policing principles. These officers are dedicated to providing the highest quality of police protection to the residents of Bellevue and ensuring this community is a safe place to live, work and raise a family.

The Village's central patrol station is located at the Public Safety Building/Village Hall in conjunction with the Fire Department. However, this is not a walk-in police station and those who require non-emergency assistance should contact the Brown County Sheriff's Office at (920) 448-4200.

## Prescription Drug Drop Off

As part of a comprehensive plan to fight drug abuse in Brown County, the Sheriff's Office is collecting unwanted residential household medications. The purpose of the collections is to prevent theft, avoid poisoning of children and pets, and to stop pollution of our local waterways.

# Municipal Court

---

The Bellevue Municipal Court handles citations issued in the Village of Bellevue for traffic and non-traffic ordinance violations. The Court's primary function is to administer justice and hold individuals accountable for their actions when found guilty of local ordinance violations. The Court imposes fines and costs, collects those fines and costs, as well as imposes and collects restitution and other miscellaneous fees. Individuals can call the Municipal Court Clerk at (920) 884-1077 to receive information about the amount and date due for fines. You can obtain information about reopening a case and the extension of time to pay fines as well.

## What If I Get a Ticket?

---

The Municipal Court page on the Village's website provides full details and options on what to do should you receive a ticket in Bellevue. If you do not take one of these options, on the day you are scheduled to appear in court, a default verdict of guilty will be charged against you. You will be sent a notice that we have found you guilty and that your fine will be due and payable by a certain date.

# Economic Development

---

Today, Bellevue's attraction for business is stronger than ever, with dynamic opportunities for growth, expansion, and success. The Community Development Department will work collaboratively with area partners to support local businesses, attract new jobs, create entrepreneurial opportunities and add value to Bellevue's economy.

## Transportation

Four major highways run through the interior of the Village. Interstate 43 bisects Bellevue as it runs from northern Green Bay to its southern terminus at the Illinois border. State Highway 172 runs from its eastern terminus at Interstate 43 in the center of Bellevue to its western terminus near Green Bay Austin Straubel International Airport. Highway 141 runs into Bellevue where it meets Interstate 43 and then continues north to Interstate 41 and up to the Michigan state line. Highway 29 also runs through the Village as it travels from the western edge of Wisconsin to its eastern terminus at Highway 42 in downtown Kewaunee, on Lake Michigan.

## Airport

Green Bay Austin Straubel International Airport is the third largest airport in Wisconsin, providing service 365 days a year, 24 hours a day for Bellevue and north-eastern Wisconsin. Green Bay Austin Straubel International Airport is located just off of State Highway 172 in Oneida, ten minutes from Bellevue, and is capable of handling carrier and cargo jet traffic.

## Port

The Port of Green Bay provides modern, state of the art facilities for safe navigation and economic cargo handling. The Green Bay port is the western most port on Lake Michigan providing direct route shipment between the Midwest and the rest of the world.

## Rail

The railroad that runs through Bellevue is principally operated by Canadian National. The rail runs along State Highway 141/29 before heading out of the Village.



# Planning & Zoning

---

The Planning and Zoning Division is responsible for the implementation of the Village's Comprehensive Plan, Zoning and Subdivision Codes. The Planning Division services residents and developers within the community by managing land use requirements for proposed residential, and commercial projects.

The Village Municipal Code is available on the website. Information is also available on required building permits. Residents are encouraged to contact the Village and review the website prior to starting projects such as fencing, decks, sheds, sprinkler systems, etc.

# Building Inspection

---

The primary mission of the Building Inspection Division is to preserve and protect the community's health, safety and welfare through enforcement of State statutes, Wisconsin Administrative Codes and Village ordinances. The Division accomplishes these goals through permitting (e.g. building, HVAC, plumbing, electrical, fences, pools), plan reviews and inspections as well as investigating complaints pertaining to housing and property maintenance, public nuisances, storm water management.

# Geographic Information System

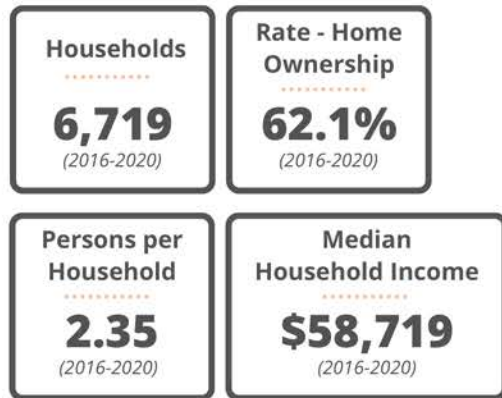

GIS connects data to a map, integrating location data (where things are) with all types of descriptive information (what things are like there). The data is used for planning and management of Village services including public works, community development, assessor, clerk/treasurer, police services, leisure services, and administration. The Village of Bellevue encourages the public to also utilize this tool to make sound planning decisions and understand the community where you live.

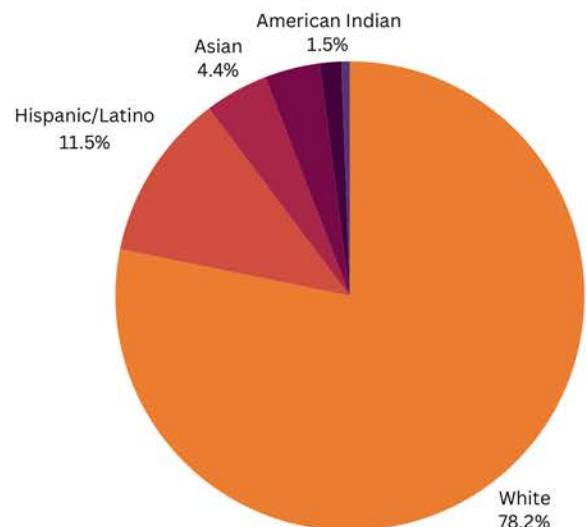
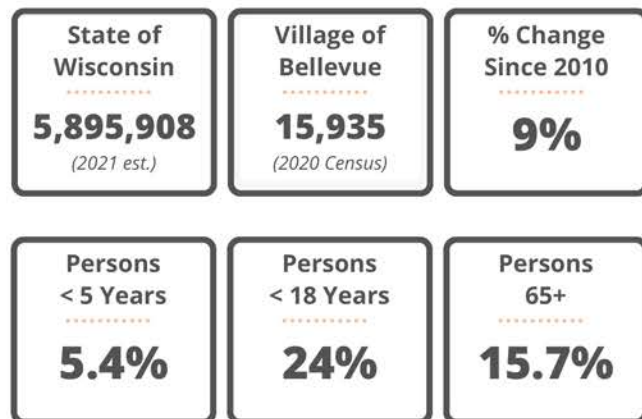

# DOG LICENSES

All dogs over the age of five (5) months are required to be licensed annually. Dog licenses must be obtained or renewed by March 31st each calendar year, per State Statute.

For new licenses, bring current rabies vaccination & spayed/neutered documentation from your veterinarian. *These items are not necessary if you are renewing a license, unless the vaccinations are expired.*

Dog licenses can be obtained via postal mail or in-person at the Village Office. If mailing in payment, don't forget the required documentation.

# BICYCLE LICENSES

All bikes in the Village of Bellevue with inflated wheels greater than 16 inches in diameter are required to be licensed. In order to issue a license, we need to know the **serial number, make, model, speed, wheel size and color.**

There is a **\$5.00 non-expiring fee** for the license. The license is good for as long as you own the bike. Should you sell or give the bike to another person, you should inform them that they must register the bike in the community in which it will be kept.

# VOTER REGISTRATION

---

You must register before you can vote in the Village of Bellevue. In order to register and vote, you must have resided in Bellevue for at least (28) consecutive days before the election. You will need one form of proof of residence (WI drivers license, utility bill, telephone bill, pay stub, bank statement) with your current Bellevue address.

## How to Register

- 1 Register **in-person** at the Village Office until 5:00 p.m. the Friday before the election.
- 2 Register **day-of** at the polls.
- 3 Register **by mail**. Download the *Voter Registration Application* from our website. Applications must be postmarked 20 days before the election.

You don't need a reason to be an absentee voter. Every registered Wisconsin voter has the ability to request an absentee ballot.
